Greymouth Masters Club: Greymouth Golden Gladiators (GG5) was one of four new clubs to join NZMS in 2010. Their secretary/treasurer is Owen Matheson and their President (and spokesman at the present time) is Peter Walls. Peter is an accomplished Masters swimmer and belonged to Lane 6 club, an offshoot of Wharenui club in Christchurch, and he set NZ records in the mid 1990's. Last year a new 8 lane, 25metre indoor pool opened in Greymouth and on April 30th 2011 Greymouth is hosting a Masters Swim meeting followed by an "after match" function at the Recreation Hotel. Masters website www.nzmastersswimming.org.nz and I have sent the entry form to the secretaries of all Region 5 (SI) clubs. Greymouth is hoping that Masters Swimmers will support their inaugural meeting and for Christchurch swimmers it is a great opportunity to compete outside Christchurch while their pools remain closed or with limited access since the earthquake.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Why you should swim a 1500m event

Excerpts from an article by the late Wally Martin published in June 1988.

"An increasing number of Master Swimmers when asked "why this event?" will reply "I enjoy swimming the 1500m events" – the best of reasons for entering any event you must admit.

Master swimmers are not there to watch, but to swim, and no other event gives as much swimming for your money. For the host club running the championships these events are creating some problems.

- 1. Cost of pool hire time makes these events a big drain on finances.
- 2. An unexciting event for spectators.
- 3. An ordeal for timekeepers and officials due to time involved

So how best to cater for these opposing interests? Wally asked for feedback on how best to cater for this event as coaches advise distance swimming for health and improved performance. We all know now the popularity of distance events particularly open water with large numbers of swimmers enjoying a range of distances up to 10km. Cambridge Club took up Wally's suggestion to hold a 1500m at their annual event.

There are postal meets which cover this distance, but because of time/cost constraints the 1500m is not always being held competitively. I agree with Wally that every opportunity should be made to ensure the event is held regularly and repeat his words 'no other event gives as much swimming for your money.'

Using technology to improve your technique

As Editor of MasterScrawl I receive all sorts of information and this note from Jacque Ross may be of particular interest to those of you who want to improve your swimming technique using the latest software applications.

Jacque Ross was fortunate to be involved in the filming of a video coaching application for swimmers (used with iPhones, touch iPods and iPads). It's a great technique and training tool called Swim Coach Plus.

During training and competition video can be recorded on a phone then replayed in real time, slow motion and frame by frame and any two videos can be displayed side by side or overlaid to facilitate immediate technique comparison, analysis and discussion. The application recognises the importance of visual feedback in the development of better biomechanics and performance, has reference video clips of each stroke and brings the functionality of products like Dartfish (used in elite sports settings) to the realm of the humble phone. It has already created quite a buzz internationally with the US, Mexican and Canadian swimmers and coaches significant early adopters and a number of the governing body magazines are seeking information for stories.

NZ's drowning toll a national disgrace

OPINION: Here we go again. Another summer fades into autumn, another shocking drowning toll is swept aside, and yet another furious debate is packed up and stored away for another year.

And what a relief that is; now that we can forget the scandal that's unfolding around our waterways and pools, and concentrate on the upcoming footy season. It was becoming hard to ignore there for a while, with 30 fatalities already recorded in 2011. Awkward stuff indeed.

What's still blindingly obvious, however, is that New Zealand's drowning toll is a disgrace. At three times the per-capita rate of the United Kingdom and Canada and twice that of Australia, it remains the ugly stain on our acclaimed aquatic wonderland status. Fewer Kiwi kids can swim to save themselves, children from the poorest families have a greater risk of drowning, and Maori and Pacific Island victims are over-represented in the annual statistics.

The irony of course is that just the opposite applies to elite swimming in New Zealand, where the vast majority of our national representatives come from white, middle-class backgrounds. That's not to say it's a race issue; it's more to do with the socio-economics. Stands to reason that those children whose parents can afford private tuition are more likely to become competitive swimmers. Correspondingly, those whose parents can't are more likely to drown.

We are hopeful that Jellie Park has sustained little damage and should be up and running by the earliest target date of 21 March pending an engineer's report on building safety and damage to pools. There is some damage to one of the indoor pools, the full extent of which will not be known until the pools are refilled.

As there is no likelihood of QEII opening in the near future, there will be a lot more users to deal with. As a consequence of extra demand, we have been advised that our Club's twice weekly times and lane entitlement will change. This could very much be long term and we now wait anxiously to hear of pool management's decision.

Our thoughts are with other Masters swimmers in Christchurch who may still be without power, water, and sewerage and may have lost loved ones.

We are now looking forward to the **Greymouth Masters** swim meet to be held at the Grey District Aquatic Centre on Saturday 30 April. This will come as a welcome relief and a good opportunity to get away with friends and family.


